Plans for 2022 were presented as follows:

- As with Asian Codes project, proposal of drafting the first paper of NCCP project (elaborated version of the MOORE paper)
- Research by international organizations is inadequate, and a working group led by the Council of National Cancer Centers of Asia, which is close to the ministries of health in each country, is an ideal



- Even in countries that "have cancer control measures," the number of countries in Asia that have developed and implemented comprehensive cancer control measures as considered in Europe and the United States is limited, and many of these countries seem to have inappropriate priorities.
  - Interview of people in charge in each country to understand the situation for the next fiscal year, including whether budgeting is being done and whether the budgeted amount is reaching the end of the line.
- By creating a conceptual diagram, grasp the cancer control measures in each country.
- Also respecting the support of Nepal, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Pakistan and other countries by the Tata Memorial Hospital in India.
- Noting the similarities in cancer incidence in Asia, the Asian Code Against Cancer is a fully backed plan and collaboration with the international organization IARC.
