

ANCCA NCCP Taskforce eMtg.21.7 (Sep 2) – Minutes of Meeting (Draft 1)

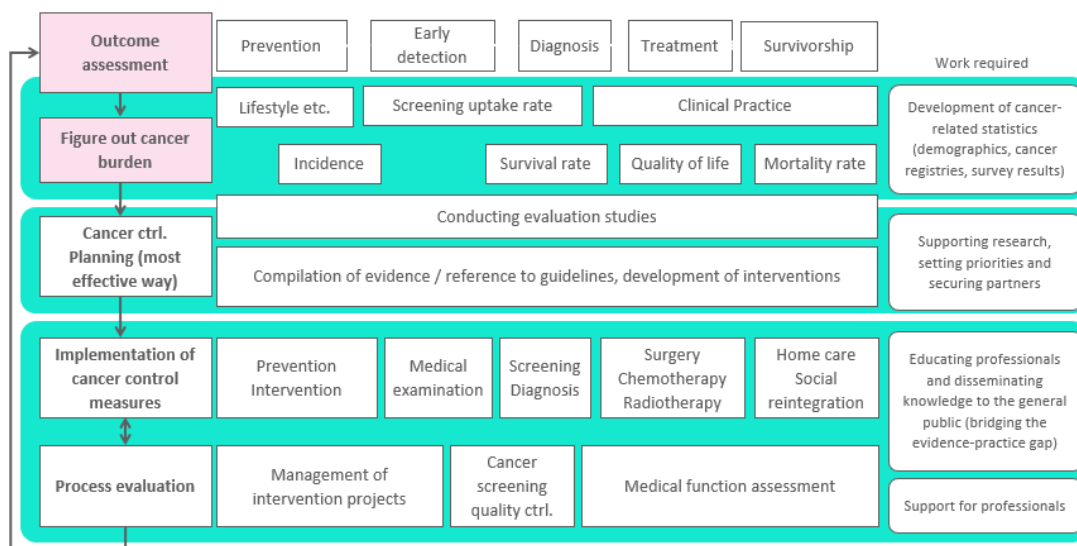

1. Introduction: brief introduction of each ANCCA member including new participants from Indonesia
2. **National Cancer Control Programme / Plan**
 - a. Situation in Nepal: NP explained about the progress on NCCP, hospital situation and cancer measures and treatments of Nepal.
 - b. Updates and upcoming actions of NCCP project: ID introduced summary including new results from Thailand and Malaysia from the NCCP survey and follow up. After completion of the survey analysis, ID will send back the feedback for each member. Regarding Nepal and Pakistan, ID will request representatives to provide additional information to maximize outcome of the survey. Moreover, as our future objective, ID mentioned that they have a motive to consult with IARC and find focal points among Asian nations.
 - c. Next concrete steps proposed by JP: JP suggested to start assessing the effectiveness of NCCPs among members, by considering and evaluating the legal basis, intervention program, evaluation arrangement and tied budget and resources for each country. The topics that are most frequently incorporated into NCCPs (screening and early detection, palliation and survivor care, cancer registry, prevention)) should be investigated further in more details. The following map shows an example of the next steps to reach a cancer control program based on scientific evidence, based on prioritization of fields of assessment.

d. Next actions (if possible until next meeting Oct 7):

- Core team to support all remaining members to further fill the excel document (incl provide Conceptual figure for those who have not yet provided it)



- Core team to support Nepal and Pakistan with additional questions to help them developing NCCP
- All members to review the NCCJ proposal for further discussions in upcoming meetings find common ground

3. **Toward an “Asian Code against Cancer” / Summary and next step**

- ID explained the progress of Asian Code against Cancer. At the next meeting, they may be able to share the names of potential stakeholder from Dharmais hospital who can be candidates of the working groups of this project.
 - JP shared slides on progresses regarding working group candidates. After quick explanation of the rules in each working group and timeline of the project, JP mentioned 1 or 2 supporters can be available in each working group from JP side. Until the next meeting, JP can also share the names of potential stakeholder. Agreements of other Asian candidates on Asia are expected until the end of this month hopefully.
 - KR shared their progress regarding the candidate of the project’s working group. Along with process of internal candidates of NCC Korea, candidates from other institutions in the country are also investigated. Upon approval and confirmation from NCC-K president, the list of candidates will be shared (hopefully at next NCCP meeting).
 - Post meeting note: VN is also currently confirming the potential participation of 4 candidate experts.
- e. Next actions (if possible until next meeting Oct 7):**
- All members to update other NCCP members on the status of their candidate selection

4. **Others (Open discussions, action Items, Next NCCP e-Mtg’21.8 and HL meeting)**

- MY (currently led mainly by clinical oncologists, Dr Suhana Yusak, Dr Ros Suzanna and Dr Malar) is considering to include new potential candidate(s) in this taskforce, currently under discussion with the Public Health Division of the Ministry of Health (MoH), and plan to inform NCCP taskforce whenever updates are available
 - BR shared a summary of the situation in Brunei, with the launch in 2019 by the MoH. of their national policy on a screening program focusing on breast, colorectal and cervical cancer, in alignment with the UICC roadmap 2030 toward the elimination of cervical cancer. BR also emphasized the importance to minimize inequalities (access to resource treatment independently from rural / urban differences and recognizing a similar access to care for minorities)
 - Secretariat-JP announced that ANCCA meetings
 - Sep 30 (16h – 17h JP/KR time): ANCCA preparation meeting to High Level meeting
 - Oct. 7 (16h – 17h JP/KR time): regular NCCP meeting
 - Nov. 1 (17h -18:30 JP/KR time): High Level Meeting with Presidents and Directors
- d. Next actions (in preparation to HL preparation meeting, Sep 30):**
- Core Team to prepare a draft NCCP taskforce achievements and upcoming plans for review by NCCP taskforce, in preparation to the HL meeting
 - KR will share a new topic for discussion at HL meeting at the HL prep meeting
 - Core meeting / all to propose a NCCP seminar around next high-level meeting with suggested speakers from IARC, UICC (to be discussed at the HL preparation meeting)
